GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

PLEASE READ ALL RULES ***NO ATTENTION WILL BE GIVEN BY JUDGES TO ANY ARTICLE WITHOUT AN ENTRY CARD AND NUMBER.**

- 1. All awards for which cash prizes are offered will be paid in cash when entries are picked up. **NO** checks will be mailed.
- 2. Any protests or complaints against the decision of the judges regarding any article or animal being exhibited must be filed with the secretary of the Fair Board before the close of the Fair on Sunday.
- 3. All exhibits will be released at 9:00 AM on Sunday of Fair Week.
- 4. NO ARTICLE OR ANIMAL SHALL BE REMOVED FROM THE FAIR BEFORE THE OFFICIAL CLOSE OF THE FAIR AT 9 AM ON SUNDAY, EXCEPT BY SPECIAL WRITTEN PERMISSION OF TWO FAIR BOARD MEMBERS. ANY UNAUTHORIZED REMOVAL OF EXHIBITS MAY CAUSE FORFEITURE OF ALL PREMIUM WON.
- 5. All exhibit halls will be closed and locked at 6:00 PM, except on Sunday at 1:00 PM.
- 6. The general supervision of the grounds and entire exhibition, police regulations, etc., are vested in the Fair Board. The superintendents shall have charge of their departments.
- 7. No person shall be allowed to sell or give away entered articles on the fairgrounds during the fair without permission of the directors.
- 8. OREGON FAIRS ASSOCIATION cards WILL NOT be honored at the rodeo.
- 9. PRE-REGISTRATION WILL OPEN JULY 1st. PRE-REGISTRATION IS ENCOURAGED. Exhibitors may obtain entry cards and tags at the post offices in Fossil, Mitchell and Spray, or at the Fair Office in Fossil. Exhibitors must bring cards and tags to the office to be initialed by the office staff BEFORE entering exhibits in the proper department. AVOID WAITING! COMPLETE YOUR ENTRY CARDS AND TAGS EARLY. Fair personnel will be available to assist exhibitors in completing their entry cards & tags and to answer questions. For more information, phone the Wheeler County Fair Office at 541-763-4560 or email wheelercountyfair@co.wheeler.or.us
- 10. Parade entries may be made by phone or in person at the Fair Office until Friday, August 6th at 7:00 PM.
- 11. Each exhibitor must have their own entry number and must fill out their own entry cards. For your convenience this can be done any time after July 1st, when you pre-register to avoid the waiting on Wednesday of the Fair.
- 12. Upon entry of each animal or article, a tag will be furnished to each exhibitor, specifying the class and number of the entry; said tags are to remain attached to such animal or article during the exhibition. Exhibitors will be furnished another card for each entry, which will be held to identify exhibits. No exhibitor will be allowed to place or attach any prize ribbons on articles or animals until after judging. Anyone doing so will forfeit all claims to premiums.
- 13. Colors denoting awards will be as follows: Blue Ribbon-First Premium, Red Ribbon-Second Premium, and White Ribbon-Third Premium.
- 14. No interference with the judges during the adjudications will be allowed, and persons doing so will forfeit the right to any premiums.
- 15. In all cases, the right is reserved to reject, or accept conditionally, any entry or application at any time, at the discretion of the board of directors. Exhibitors must at all times, give the necessary personal attention to their entry and at the close must take charge of that entry.

OPEN CLASS LIVESTOCK - RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1. A livestock exhibitor must obtain an exhibitor number at the Fair Office. Pre-registration is encouraged. Numbers will not be given by the Superintendent.
- 2. No entries will be received by phone. Entry cards may be picked up from the Fair office or at the Post Office in Fossil, Spray or Mitchell. You may call and ask for an exhibitor's number.
- 3. All livestock tags must be attached to the pens of the exhibitor's livestock. Livestock will be accepted on Wednesday of Fair Week from 7:30 AM to 7:00 PM. Please see the Livestock Superintendent for stall or pen assignments.
- 4. Exhibitors will provide the Livestock Superintendent with the age of their animal when registering.
- 5. All livestock must be on exhibit by 7:00 PM Wednesday of fair week.
- 6. Additional classes will be provided if deemed necessary by the Livestock Superintendent. If there are three or more entries of any breed in any class, a separate class will be made for that breed.
- 7. In all cases, the right is reserved to reject, or accept conditionally, any entry at any time by the Fair Board.
- 8. Animals not manageable at the time of the fair will not be accepted as entries and must be removed from the fairgrounds. The decision shall be at the option of the Fair Board and shall be final.
- 9. No animal or bird that shows evidence of any infectious or contagious disease shall be allowed to remain on the grounds. Cattle exhibited must be Brucellosis free. Animals exhibited from livestock herds tested not clean must have clearance from the Oregon State Department of Agriculture.
- 10. Bedding will be furnished by the exhibitor.
- 11. All pens must be cleaned by 8 AM. The exhibitors must haul animal waste to the designated dumping location.
- 12. The Fair Board will not pay any transportation costs.
- 13. The judges will in no case award a premium where there is not merit. When one animal is exhibited in a section or class, only one premium will be awarded.
- 14. Judges of all livestock will have regard to symmetry, early maturity, size, general qualities and characteristics of any breed they inspect. They will make due allowances for the effect of feeding and other circumstances on the character and condition of the animal.
- 15. Exhibitors must have the entry card in a conspicuous place on the animal during the judging. NOTE: On penned animals, please place cards, ribbons, etc., out of reach of the animals.
- 16. No attention will be given by judges to any animal or participant without its card or number.
- 17. OWNER OR ATTENDANT MUST BE PRESENT DURING JUDGING OF LIVESTOCK ENTRIES EXCEPT PENNED ANIMALS.
- 18. If it is determined that an animal has been entered in a division or class in which it does not belong, it is the duty of the Superintendent to investigate, and if by mistake, to correct it; otherwise no premium will be paid.
- 19. All entries of purebred cattle shall contain name and number as shown on the Certificate of Registration. Registration papers must correspond with the animals and will be checked by the Livestock Superintendent. Exhibitors must provide papers upon request.
- 20. All grade animals of the same breed shall follow the sire. No registered livestock may be entered in grade classes.
- 21. All exhibits must be in the name of the bona-fide owner.
- 22. Animal age is determined by the date of the fair.
- 23. No animal will be permitted to enter the arena unless under halter and in the care of an attendant. Cattle exhibited in pens are excepted from this rule. Registered livestock may be shown on halter.
- 24. No premium shall be allowed to animals which are spavined, ring boned, blind or otherwise defective.
- 25. All other rules and regulations apply where applicable.
- 26. Livestock stalls must be cleaned with waste hauled to the designated area by exhibitor by 2:00 PM Sunday of Fair Week, or exhibitor will be charged a fee.
- 27. All livestock must be kept on the Fairgrounds until 9:00 AM Sunday of Fair Week. Exception to this rule are horses that are not boarded on the grounds and animals removed with written permission of the Fair Board. Forfeiture of all premiums will result if animals are removed early.
- 28. Sportsman-like conduct is expected at all times, and the Superintendent shall be in charge.

OPEN CLASS GENERAL RULES

THESE RULES APPLY TO EXHIBITORS IN THE OPEN CLASS DIVISION, OTHER THAN LIVESTOCK.

PRE-REGISTRATION IS ENCOURAGED (See General Rules and Regulations)

NO entry fees will be charged.

- 1. All articles must be entered between the hours of 1 PM and 7 PM, Wednesday, Fair Week. NOTE LIVESTOCK ENTRY DEADLINE UNDER LIVESTOCK section.
- 2. All entries must be entered, tagged and in place in their building by 7PM on Wednesday of fair week.
- 3. Standard containers will be furnished for cut flowers.
- 4. All references to ages will be effective as of August 1 2021, the date all exhibits are accepted on the fair grounds.
- 5. Read the General Rules in the front of the Fair Book and also the rules for classes you are planning to enter.
- 6. Fair Management is not responsible for errors in entries, BUT Superintendents can make necessary corrections if articles are found to be incorrectly entered.
- 7. The Fair Board will use every precaution in its power for the safe preservation of all articles on exhibit, but will not be responsible for loss or damage.
- 8. No article deemed unworthy shall be awarded a premium, BUT no premiums shall be withheld merely because there is no competition.
- 9. Any error in the recording of premiums awarded caused by oversight shall be subject to correction.
- 10. In case of a point tie in Special Awards, the winner will be determined by the exhibitor having the most BLUE Ribbons.
- 11. Items MUST be entered in their own categories, if one is listed, rather than in Other or Miscellaneous. If in "Other" or "Miscellaneous", put the names on entry tags and blanks.
- 12. "Special" and "Best of Show" awards which are Sponsored by individuals, merchants, organizations are a valuable added incentive to our premium awards. (Those who participate would appreciate hearing from winners of the awards they donate, acknowledging their contributions).
- 13. Entries will be released Sunday at 9 AM.
- 14. No article or animal shall be removed from the Fair before the official time except by special WRITTEN permission of two Fair Board members.
- 15. All awards for which cash prizes are offered will be paid in cash at the Fair Office when entries are picked up between 9:00AM and 12:00PM Sunday.

SHEAVES OF GRAIN & GRASSES MUST BE CROP OF THE PRESENT YEAR, GROWN BY EXHIBITOR.

Hints:

All sheaves are judged for quality and attractiveness. They should be 12" in length from bottom of head to base of the sheaf, with the base even and 2" across at the butt, (exception on bromes and fescues which can be 1" across butt) where they will be measured. Tie tightly with string 3 times. Label 'Other Kinds' by name on the entry tags. Sheaves must fulfill these requirements.

DIVISION J AGRICULTURE

Open Class Superintendent - Terri Hunt

Open to Wheeler County Residents ONLY

All exhibits must be entered, tagged and in place, in their buildings by 7 PM, Wednesday of Fair Week. Agriculture exhibits must have been grown in Wheeler County, and they MUST be viable.

HINT: To prepare an attractive display, consider the following when you select and prepare vegetables for fair:

- Trueness to type-specimens should be typical of the variety in shape, color, and size.
- *Quality and condition*-specimens should be edible, in prime condition, and free from blemishes or damage from insects, disease, or handling. Specimens with deepest color are preferred.
- *Uniformity*-specimens should be alike in size, shape, color, texture, and stage of maturity.
- *Size*-contrary to popular opinion, large entries do not have a competitive edge over other entries (except for special entries such as largest pumpkin, watermelon, or head of cabbage). Largeness suggests coarseness, over maturity, and possible poor quality. Medium-sized specimens are more typical of a variety and most desired.
- *Cleanliness*-dirt detracts from the natural attractiveness of vegetables and conveys an unfavorable impression to the judges and the public. Wipe cucumbers, tomatoes, pepper, and other soft skinned vegetables with a damp cloth. Wash or lightly brush soil from potatoes, carrots, and beets. Clean leafy vegetables such as Swiss chard by dipping in cool water.

- Place flowers in container of warm water (100°-110° F). Add a preservative and place in a cool location for a minimum of 2 hours; 6-8 hours is better
- When ready to begin arranging or exhibiting, re-cut the stems and again remove foliage which will be in the water
- Add a chemical preservative at every step of the construction
- Add fresh water daily
- Homemade preservative for cut flowers: combine one can of non-diet citrus drink (i.e. 7 Up) with four cans of water, add a few drops of bleach.

Add buttermilk, vegetable oil, and vanilla, beating until smooth. Spread into the pans and bake about 20-25 minutes. Test to see if a toothpick comes out clean. Cool for 5 minutes in the pan before turning out onto a rack.

To make the frosting mix the butter, cream, and vanilla together in a bowl. Slowly beating in the sugar until thick and creamy.

Ice cake with above frosting and enter on a covered board or paper plate.



Bread Sticks

Ingredients:
1 Cup Hot Milk
4 Tablespoons Butter
1 1/2 Tablespoons Sugar
2 Teaspoons Salt
1 Package Dry Yeast
1/4 Cup Warm Water
3 Cups White Flour, Approx.
1 Egg White, Lightly beaten with 1 Tablespoon
Cold Water
Coarse Salt

Mix the hot milk, butter, sugar and salt in a large bowl and let cool to lukewarm. Stir the yeast into the warm water and let is stand for 5 minutes to dissolve. Add the dissolved yeast and 2 cups of flour to the first mixture, stir vigorously, and add enough of the remaining flour so that the dough pulls away from the sides of the bowl. Turn out onto a lightly floured board, knead for a minute or two, and let rest for 10 minutes. Resume kneading until smooth and elastic. Put in a buttered bowl, cover, and let rise in a warm place until double in bulk. Punch down and roll out with a rolling pin into a rectangle 1/2 inch thick. Cut into strips about 1/2 inch wide and of uniform length. Place 1 inch apart on buttered cookie, cover, and let rise a little. Brush with the egg-white glaze and sprinkle with coarse salt, before baking. Preheat oven to 300 degrees. Bake bread sticks for 30 minutes or until lightly browned.



EMERGENCY PLAN



Purpose:

To provide safety for the citizens attending the Wheeler County Fair & Rodeo, in the event of a natural or human-caused disaster.

Law Enforcement/Search & Rescue:

The Wheeler County Sheriff's Office (WCSO) performs these responsibilities. WCSO will be Night Watch: responsible for all law enforcement/emergency • operations, incl. (but not limited to) traffic, enforcement of laws and search & rescue.

Medical:

First aid on the fairgrounds is provided by a team of Emergency Medical Technicians through Fossil Ambulance and by Asher Community Health Center, adjacent to the fairgrounds.

Fire Fighting Services:

- Fossil Volunteer Fire Department performs this responsibility. Inspections have been made of all buildings on the fairgrounds for hazards.
- Exits are clearly visible for speedy evacuation of the public in the event of a fire or other disaster

Power Failure:

Due to the low number of night functions,

power failure is a minimal but still important concern.

In the event of power failure, the public will be advised to keep calm. Fair Board members and staff will assist the public with safe evacuation, calling for additional help if needed.

A night watchperson will be on duty during overnight hours.

Fair Board:

- Responsible for coordinating all task assign-
- Cooperation with all agencies and personnel having task assignments.
- Coordinate and assist with communications.
- Include Emergency Plan in fair book.
- Post Emergency Plan in visible locations.


